THE ADVENT WREATH - The Third Candle: The Candle of Joy

The congregation remains standing

The Reader:

Each year during the Holy Season of Advent, we light these candles. They together stand for us as a symbol of Christ breaking into a darkened world. We prepare during this Advent season to celebrate how that light first broke in at his birth on Christmas Day. We also look forward to his return at his Second Coming, when the fullness of that light will shine on those who are prepared to receive him in joy.

The four outer candles represent Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. The center candle is the Christ Candle to be lighted on Christmas Eve celebrating Jesus's appearance among us and his embodiment of all these virtues.

On the First Sunday of Advent, we lit the first candle in our Advent Wreath, the candle of hope. We light it again today remembering that our hope is in Jesus.

(The first candle is lighted.)

On the Second Sunday of Advent, we lit the Candle of Peace. We light it again today remembering that Jesus is the Prince of Peace.

(The second candle is lighted.)

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent, also called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin word "rejoice". It reminds us of Mary's joy when Gabriel announced that her child would be the Savior of the world. It also reminds us of our own heightened anticipation and joy as we contemplate our Savior's birth and his future coming.

Therefore, today, we light the Candle of Joy. Jesus is the joy of the world. (*The third candle is lighted.*)

From the Book of Isaiah we read the words of our Lord:

"Be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating; for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight." – Isaiah 65:18

Let Us Pray.

The people read aloud together

Lord God, we light this candle to thank you for your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, who brings your joy into a darkened world. We who have walked in the shadow of the valley of death have found life in the resurrection of your son. We give you thanks and praise that our Lord Jesus Christ lives and reigns with you in your glory, and in the unity of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

The Officiant says to the people

Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to set forth his praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

Silence may be kept.

Officiant and People together, all kneeling

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Priest alone stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

All stand

Officiant Lord, open our lips.

People And our mouths shall proclaim your praise.

THE BIDDING AND THE LORD'S PRAYER

In the season of Advent, it is our responsibility and joy to prepare ourselves to hear once more the message of the Angels, to go to Bethlehem and see the Son of God lying in a manger.

Let us hear and heed in Holy Scripture the story of God's loving purpose from the time of our rebellion against him until the glorious redemption brought to us by his holy Child Jesus, and let us look forward to the yearly remembrance of his birth with hymns and songs of praise.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

And, "In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands; they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like clothing;


like a cloak you will roll them up, and like clothing they will be changed.


