


OPENING ACCLAMATION AND COLLECT FOR PURITY

LIGHTING OF CHRIST CANDLE

Leader As the four outer candles of our Advent Wreath are lighted this evening, we remember that each was given light on its respective Sunday during the Season of Advent. The first candle honors God's peace because Jesus is the Prince of Peace. The second honors God's hope for us because Jesus is the Hope of all humanity. The third honors God's joy because Jesus brings Joy to the world. The fourth honors God's love because Jesus is the Love of God made perfect by His life and presence among us.

Tonight, on Christmas Eve, we light the center candle, the Christ Candle, bringing all four virtues of Christ into one glory and celebration. It reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to save us from sin. His birth was for his death, his death was for our birth! As John the Baptist announced: "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" Christ himself is before all things, and in Christ all things hold together.

The Christ Candle is now lighted.

THE LESSON Isaiah 9:2-7

Lector A reading from the Prophet Isaiah:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness-on them light has shined.

You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy;

they rejoice before you

as people exult when dividing plunder.

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

During Holy Communion, if you are unable to receive communion at the altar rail, please notify an usher so that communion can be brought to you.




