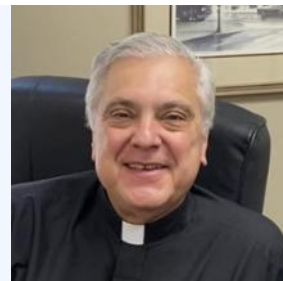

1 Corinthians 15:57



Living the victorious life sounds like something of accomplishment and achievement. Yet, it is exactly the opposite. It is a complete, glorious, gracious, unmerited, unearned, freely given, and love inspired gift from Jesus, by the will of God the Father, through the power of the Holy

Spirit! When we hear the word victory, we rally around the notion that we have won something. The truth is that it is Christ who has fought the battle, won the victory, and has freely chosen to give that victory to us! Living the victorious life is something to be received and held preciously, not to be earned or in any way conquered.

Grace Church is living the Victorious Life in Christ principally because we have surrendered ourselves to the power of the Holy Spirit, giving us the divine guidance and wisdom necessary to live holy and loving



lives for those around us. We are praying, serving, feeding, worshipping, studying, giving, sacrificing, and loving as much as we ever have before. To see the true gospel industry of the church lived out day by day among our people is something divine and humbling to behold. It is a holiness and a goodness that can come only from Jesus as he courses through our veins and lives through us to love those we encounter.

Of course, there are times when we fail to love as we should. God understands and forgives our shortcomings and uses them to strengthen us, to teach us, and to redirect us. It cannot be lost upon us

though, that our faithful people have by and large given themselves over in Christ-like sacrifice, surrender, generosity, and love for one another and for those beyond our walls.

Grace Church is living the Victorious Life in Christ by our being transformed into the likeness of Jesus more and more each day, week, month, and year. This is true for us as a congregation and as individual believers. I have spoken before how we should be able to recognize holier, sanctified, and anointed differences in ourselves as we strive to be like Jesus. Always remember the Identity shattering words of the Apostle Paul, *"I am crucified with Christ, therefore I no longer live. Jesus Christ lives in me."* Galatians 2:20 This truth

teaches us that it isn't merely a matter of adding Christ to our lives, but instead a matter of eradicating and spiritually crucifying and obliterating our old selves so that he can fully and totally live in us and through us. An actual change of identity takes place where we no longer believe, act, think, or love as we did before! We truly become new people in Christ. This is a far more radical and consciousness-changing metamorphosis than anything we ever might have been thinking on our own.



In the short time that Patty and I have been a part of this precious and extraordinarily loving church family, we have witnessed and heard the

testimonies of so many who have grown in their faith and who are now serving to strengthen others. Grace Church is evermore a people of prayer, not only in our Noon Wednesday Prayer Service but throughout all the days of the week in our homes and hearts. We are ever more living by faith and under the promises of God, trusting in our Lord's power far more than our human strength and resources. We are ever more a people of God's Holy Spirit.

Now here might be the greatest take away and illustration for those who cannot wrap their heads around the notion

that a victorious life is for them because of their hardships and realities. Living the Victorious Life in Christ comes from our full acceptance of everything God is giving us and recognizing that we live in triumph because



of Jesus *no matter what our circumstances might be!* You might say I don't feel like my life is victorious or a triumph in any way. I am lonely, homeless, near bankruptcy, suffering from depression, in bad relationships with my family members and others, living under a terminal medical diagnosis, looking back on a career of failed or mediocre employment experiences, mourning the loss of loved ones, and more. The good news is that none of this, nor all of this, is any impediment to the Victorious Life in Christ! In fact, it is for you more specially than perhaps many others that Jesus comes to bring the joy and glory you seem to be lacking. Our circumstances and even our most

oppressive situations in no way prevent the victorious life or even diminish it. Even in the face of death itself, victory is certain, joy is overflowing, and eternity is our assurance in our Savior!

Never forget that it is never our victory but always Jesus's victory that makes us triumphant! If we have achieved something, that is only because of his favor and grace. If we

"The Lord said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in your weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

And, believe me, that is extraordinarily good news. It is good news because the goodness, holiness, grace, and love of Jesus place us in positions of mercy, forgiveness, and grace that we would never be able to give to ourselves, much less to others around us. Leaving everything in his hands is sweet holiness and goodness beyond all description and articulation.

Ultimately, living the Victorious Life in Christ means embracing the overarching truth of the Good Friday death and Easter morning resurrection of Jesus. For it is by these mighty works of salvation that we gain eternal victory because he loves us that much.

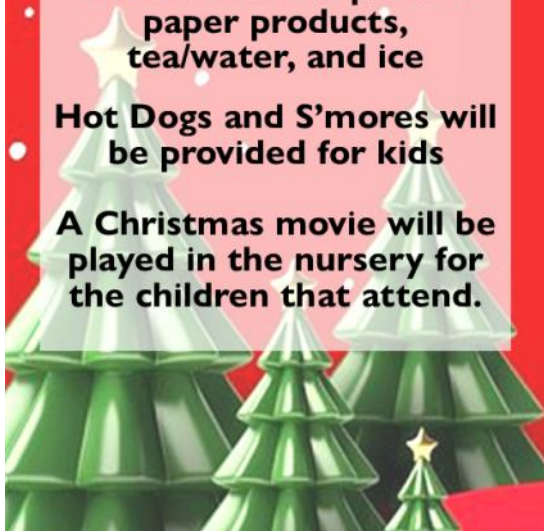

From the Senior Warden

“Hold Steadfast”

I have always been fascinated with palm trees. If you ask any of my college roommates, they will tell you palm trees were a prominent theme in the decor of my dorm rooms and apartments. Initially, I loved them because they were different from anything we had in West Texas and they represented sunshine, happiness, and fun times spent on the beach. After college, I spent most of my twenties living in Florida and I began to see another side of the trees I loved so much.

Palm trees are strong and incredibly resilient in the face of powerful storms. I was reminded of this while watching news coverage on Hurricane Melissa last month. What caught my attention the most wasn't the destruction of a category 5 hurricane, but what was left standing in Melissa's wake - the palm trees. I couldn't help but draw some parallels between that storm and the storm our congregation has been facing since Father Ed's diagnosis.

As we navigate this season, I believe the palm tree has much to teach us about how we can weather this storm together. Our strength, like that of a palm tree, lies in our roots and in our ability to remain flexible when the winds are blowing all around us. I

have already seen this in action in our Grace community over the past month. We have remained rooted in our faith, in our love for one another, and in our trust in God's plan. We have been flexible, changing direction last minute, welcoming new faces at the altar, and shifting responsibilities when needed. We have a congregation full of loving, talented individuals and I am so grateful for the ideas and help that has been offered as we navigate these uncharted waters. I certainly never imagined facing a situation like this when I agreed to serve as Senior Warden. Yet throughout the past month, I have been encouraged and uplifted by the support I have received from members of our congregation and the diocese.

As Father Ed continues his treatment, I ask that you all continue to be flexible. We may need to do some things differently for a time, but this season will not last forever. Stay rooted in your faith, continue to love one another and trust in God's plan for Father Ed and for our church. We will get through this storm as a graceful grove of palm trees, standing tall and steadfast on the other side.

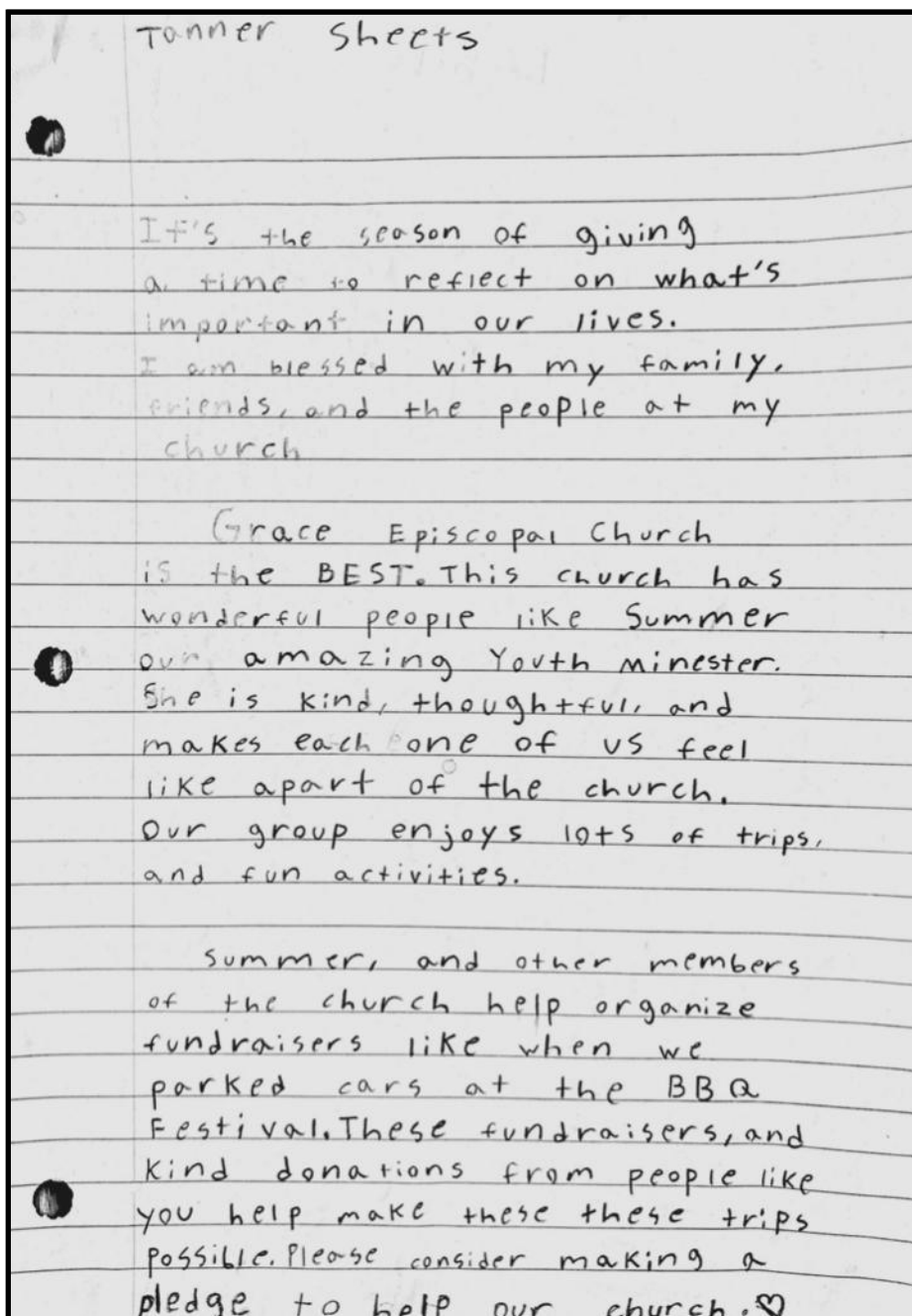


Dinner Group Signups

Making a Case for Grace



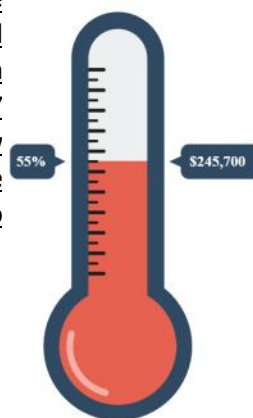

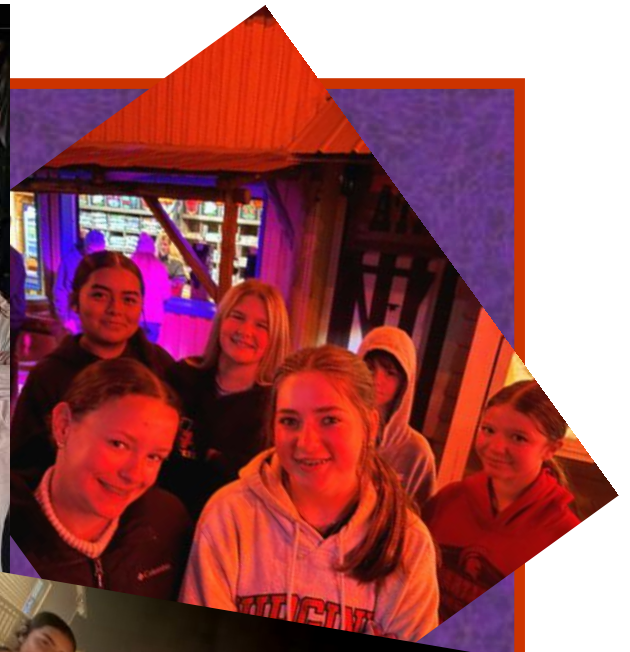

Grace Episcopal Homeless Shelter meals, 2025-26

For more years than anyone can remember (we can go back 30), Grace and other Lexington churches have provided a hot meal one day a month to residents of the Crisis Ministry Homeless Shelter. The assignment is simple: provide a hot meal for around 60 people and bring it to the shelter. Stay and serve if you'd like to visit with residents and give them a chance to thank you and share some of their lives. It's the longevity and dedication that has made this ministry unique.

Some on the list have been providing meals since the beginning. Others have joined as original team members have retired or moved on. Grace Episcopal's assigned day is the first Monday of every month. Over the years, we've served lasagnas, chicken pies, fried chicken, ham, hot dogs, beans, potatoes, bread, cookies, cakes, pies and much, much more to 50-60 people each month. This is perhaps one of the easiest and also one of the most rewarding ministries of Grace—and perhaps one of the longest-running outreach ministries of our church.

Social Concerns Commission would like to thank all of the dedicated servers and all of those who have served in the past. Even though each month is "covered," there is always opportunity to help, either with a

monthly fill assignment or a last minute fill-in. Please let Barbara, Sandy, or Maureen know that you're interested in helping, and you can become a part of this awesome ministry.
